TORONTO, Canada: In July and August, the **Bloor St. Culture Corridor** - Toronto's most diverse arts and culture district - celebrates summer in the city with an astounding selection of over 135 arts and culture events. From Bathurst to Bay Streets, the Annex to Yorkville Village, visitors and Torontonians have access to world class arts and culture presentations at leading destinations and venues in the heart of Toronto. Whether you are seeking visual arts, renowned authors in conversation, music concerts, films, or proximity to rare and ancient artifacts, there is something for everyone on the **Bloor St. Culture Corridor**. Highlights in July and August include major exhibitions, free outdoor concert series, pop-up culinary events, free cultural neighbourhood walks, documentary film screenings, and much more.

Highlights on Bloor St. Culture Corridor in July and August include:

PANAMANIA, the 35-day arts and culture program presented by CIBC to enrich the TORONTO 2015 Pan Am/Parapan Am Games will be celebrated on the **Bloor St. Culture Corridor** in July. The **Bloor Hot Docs Cinema** presents Pan American documentary film screenings honouring the diverse stories of Pan American people, including *Oblivion* screening on July 11, 2015 at 1pm, *Buena Vista Social Club* screening on July 12, 2015 at 4:30pm, and *Waste Land* screening on August 8, 2015 at 4:30pm.
